Over the course of the next month, our third, fourth and fifth grade students will be taking very important state tests. These tests are very important for Webb. The state uses these results to aid in determining the success of our school. We ask for the help of our families as we embark on these important tests. We also ask that you discuss the test at home with your child and talk about the importance of doing their best. The fifth grade students will continue M-STEP testing this week on Tuesday. They are moving on to math this week. The fourth graders will be starting with ELA (reading and writing this week). This is quite a rigorous test, so we need to make sure all of the students are well rested, have a good breakfast (we will always provide that at school from 7:40-8:00AM) and are ready to test. It is always helpful when students get support from home as well to encourage them to give their best effort. They have been working hard all year and have a lot of the skills they need to be successful. Our biggest barrier is often stamina. Students struggle to stay focused for the time they need to be successful. We appreciate any help you can give us to encourage them to persevere and do their best.

Students who walk home, must go home and cannot return until after 6PM (when latchkey is done for the day) without an adult. We do NOT monitor the playground after school. Adults MUST monitor their students. We appreciate your help with this.
