On Monday, April 8th, Michigan is on the pathway to experience the solar eclipse. While observing a solar eclipse can be a memorable and educational experience, looking directly at the sun during an eclipse can cause permanent eye damage. The timeframe for the solar eclipse in Hazel Park falls between 2:00 pm and 4:00 pm, with peak time at 3:14 pm. Since this event falls during dismissal, we will be releasing students early. This will allow our students, staff, and families to get home and observe the eclipse safely.

Solar Eclipse Information

A solar eclipse happens when the moon passes between the sun and the Earth, blocking out the sun's light either partially or completely. This event can be a fascinating learning opportunity for our students, providing them with a firsthand experience of a celestial phenomenon

Here are some safety guidelines we will be following

- Solar Viewing Glasses: We will provide ISO-certified solar viewing glasses for all students. These glasses are specially designed to protect the eyes while allowing safe viewing of the sun during an eclipse.
- Educational Activities: Teachers will incorporate the solar eclipse into their lesson plans, providing students with background information about eclipses, the science behind them, and safety precautions.
- We encourage you to talk to your child about the solar eclipse and the importance of following safety guidelines.

Playground After School

As the weather gets nicer, more families choose to stay and play on the playground after school. Please don't forget our school rule about playground use after school. Any students staying on the playground after school MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY AN ADULT and the adult must be physically in the playground area. This does NOT count for older siblings. Students who walk home, must go home and cannot return until after 6PM (when latchkey is done for the day) without an adult. We do NOT monitor the playground after school. Adults MUST monitor their students. We appreciate your help with this.

Open Board Position

On March 20, 2024, Board of Education Trustee Dawn Rice resigned from her position. The Board of Education is now seeking applications to fill this opening and serve the remainder of her term, which expires on December 31, 2024. Applications will be accepted electronically through Tuesday, April 10, 2024. Applicants must reside in Hazel Park or Ferndale to apply.

A school board member plays a crucial role in collaborating with the community to make decisions on various issues. The four major roles of a board member are:

- Envisioning the district's educational future, setting goals, and defining strategies to guide the district toward that vision.
- Hiring a superintendent who will effectively implement the board's policies and manage the district to achieve its goals.
- Monitoring and assessing the district's performance, and keeping the public informed and engaged.
- Advocating for students and public schools within the community, state, and national levels.




